

Should I use the Version 3 Program Requirements?

To earn the ENERGY STAR, a home must be certified under Version 3 of the program. requirements, unless it is located in California, Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, Guam, Hawaii, Illinois, Iowa, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Montana, Nevada, New Jersey, New York Northern Mariana Islands, Oregon, Puerto Rico, Rhode Island, Texas, U.S. Virgin Islands, Vermont, or Washington. A home in these locations must be certified using Regional Specifications.

How to Certify a Home

Select the core energy efficiency measures

Working with a Home Energy Rater, builders configure the preferred set of energy measures for their home and verify that the resulting HERS Index meets or exceeds the ENERGY STAR HERS Index Target. The National Program Requirements contain more information about how the target is defined and the typical measures used to meet this target. See the National Program Requirements (182KB).





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

ELIGIBILITY

Multifamily projects permitted prior to January 1, 2021, may continue to certify through the MFHR or Certified Homes program, based on the eligibility requirements of those programs.



Program Version Plans for 2019

- OR is scheduled to implement the WA/OR v3.2 program requirements for homes permitted after 4/1/2019.
- No other states are currently scheduled to implement a new version in 2019.
- However, NC, PA, OR, and VA are under review for possible implementation of the National Version 3.1 requirements.
- Working on better tailoring the program requirements for Puerto Rico and the US Virgin Islands.
- Refreshing program requirements for manufactured housing.







#1. 4- and 5-story building eligibility requirements

- Dwelling units in buildings ≤ 5 stories are eligible to participate regardless of their HVAC and water heating configuration.
- Footnote 5 has been revised to recommend that centralized heating, cooling, and hot water systems be modeled using the RESNET Guidelines for Multifamily Ratings.





#2. Required rating and registration with Verification Oversight Org.

 We now explicitly require homes to receive a rating and be registered with an EPA-approved VOO.

#4. Low-end bedroom pressure-balancing limit specified

A low-end bedroom pressure-balancing limit has been specified.

Old Policy < 150 CFM: ? to +3 Pa ≥ 150 CFM: ? to +5 Pa ≥ 150 CFM: -5 to +5 Pa

- Footnote has clarified door configurations during testing:
 - Doors separating bedrooms from the main body of the house shall be closed (e.g., a door between a bedroom and a hallway)
 - Doors to rooms that can only be entered from the bedroom shall be open (e.g., a closet, a bathroom)





#5. Increased tolerances for HVAC Design

- Conditioned floor area used in the design can be:
 - 100 ft² smaller 300 ft² larger than the rated home.
- Window area used in the design can be:
 - 15 ft² smaller 60 ft² larger than the rated home, or,
 - For homes with > 500 ft² of windows, 3% smaller to 12% larger
- Heating capacity of furnaces paired with cooling can be:
 - 100 400% of the heating load.



- 1. Import specifications from projected rating file
- 2. Inspect home using RaterPRO tablet app
- 3. Export confirmed rating back to HERS software

Open Source Background

- Community has consistently requested an open-source project for a variety of reasons:
 - To run on organizations' own servers for independent control
 - To integrate with existing systems (scheduling, billing, etc.)
 - To customize for individual needs
- Solicited input last year at a RESNET pre-conference session
- Offered three options to make RaterPRO more "open."
 Consensus was open source project would be the best path.
- EPA agrees Making RaterPRO open-source fulfills EPA's goal of investing in the infrastructure of the rating industry at large





Phased Rollout for Open Source

Phase 1: Code Preview

- Preview of pre-release source code
- Limited documentation

Phase 2: Free-to-Fork

- EPA will continue to own and operate 'RaterPRO'
- Version 1.0 source code released under MIT License
 - 3rd parties can fork versions on their own servers
 - Can sell modified version as commercial product
 - Must re-brand (can't use the name "RaterPRO")
- Limited EPA support resources

Future of Open Source

- EPA's focus in 2019 is on v1.0 users' needs, but excited to see what community does with open-source forks in meantime
- EPA interested in a collaborative open source project:
 - EPA would work with community to set development priorities
 - EPA would manage pull requests from community contributors
 - Features would appear in "canonical" RaterPRO that EPA hosts and be published for 3rd-party use in forked versions
- Depends on community uptake and interest. Let us know!



*As of January 1, 2014, EPA is no longer offering ENERGY STAR certification for medical office buildings or residence halls/dormitories/barracks.

- New construction can include significant gut rehabilitations when defined as a change of use, reconstruction of a vacant structure, or when construction work requires that the building be out of service for at least 30 consecutive days.
- 2. The primary use of the building must be for residential purpose, i.e. the residential and residential associated common area must occupy more than 50% of the building's occupiable⁵ square footage. A garage is not considered 'occupiable'. Common area includes any spaces within the building that serves a function in support of the residential part of the building that is not part of a dwelling unit. This includes spaces used by residents, such as corridors, stairs, lobbies, laundry rooms, exercise rooms, and residential recreation rooms. This also includes offices used by building management, administration or maintenance and all special use areas located in the building to serve and support the residents such as day-care facilities, gyms, dining halls, etc.
- 3. Any above-grade story with 20% or more occupiable⁵ space, including commercial space, shall be counted towards the total number of stories for the purpose of determining eligibility. An above-grade story is one for which more than half of the gross surface area of the exterior walls is above-grade.
- 4. Four (4) and five (5) story buildings with in-unit heating and cooling and a central domestic hot water system where solar energy provides at least 50% of the domestic hot water needs for the residential units, will qualify through the ENERGY STAR Certified Homes program as long as all other eligibility requirements of that program are met.
- 5. Per ASHRAE 62.2-2010, occupiable space is any enclosed space inside the pressure boundary and intended for human activities or continual human occupancy, including, but not limited to, areas used for living, sleeping, dining, and cooking, toilets, closets, halls, storage and utility areas, and laundry areas
- For mixed-use buildings, exclude the retail/commercial area when determining the square footage of the "building".





 - Need RESNET to approve ERI above 5 stories
- Jan 2019- Dec 2019: MFNC-specific training not req
- Jan 2020: Raters must complete MFNC training
- Jan 2021: MFNC <u>required</u> for buildings with permit dates <u>January 1, 2021</u> and later

- Incorrect refrigerant charge.

The installation process impacts airflow and refrigerant charge

- Airflow is impacted by the installation:
 - Fan-speed setting
 - Components attached to the system (like the filter)
 - Duct system installed
- Refrigerant charge is impacted by the installation:
 - Length of refrigerant line





Why is this relevant to HERS / ERI ratings?

- Today, installation faults have zero impact on a HERS or ERI rating.
- Not only do these faults impact efficiency, they impact performance.
- ENERGY STAR has promoted quality installation since 2011.
- However, uniform and practical procedures for Raters to assess systems will be a more effective approach.
- And, HERS / ERI points can be granted in exchange.





Guiding principles of the standard

- Take a 'carrot' rather than a 'stick' approach.
- Reward incremental improvement by HVAC professionals and Raters.
- Rely upon procedures that deliver value in and of themselves.





Conceptual overview of standard

- Follow the insulation quality-installation model:
 - Grade III:
 - The default.
 - HVAC system installation quality is not assessed.
 - No HERS points earned (but no penalty either).

- Grade II:

- Rater assesses HVAC system.
- HVAC system installation quality is so-so.
- Some HERS points are earned.


– Grade I:

- Rater assesses HVAC system.
- HVAC system installation quality is pretty good.
- Full HERS points are earned.

Summary

- A major step towards unifying ENERGY STAR and HERS ratings.
- For Raters: provide additional value during site visits.
- For ENERGY STAR builders: earn HERS points for things they're basically already investing in.
- For utilities: quantify savings from proper HVAC design and installation.
- Overall, will help slowly transform HVAC design and installation.

VOO Eligibility Criteria

- In August, we released a Request For Information about expanding VOO eligibility criteria to include ISO/IEC 17065 accreditation.
- ISO/IEC 17065 is an international standard for recognizing organizations that certify products, processes, and services.
- 11 individual organizations and groups submitted comments.
- We also conducted additional outreach to ensure key stakeholders had their viewpoint represented and understood the possible changes.
- We expect to release a Response to Comments in early March.
